MEMBERS OF COMPANY B WHO WERE SLAVE HOLDERS OR FROM SLAVE HOLDING FAMILIES

Avery, Thomas E. His mother, Mary, is listed as living in "Bowdon District", a farmer and the owner of 11 slaves. Thomas was only 16 when he enlisted at Bowdon in July, 1861.

Barrow, William H. C. He was a 20-21-year-old mechanic-carpenter living at home when he enlisted in March, 1862. He is listed as owning 1 slave. We do not know why or how this young man was a slave owner unless he had inherited the slave through his father, Rev. James, who was the son of Moses Barrow a large land holder of Washington County who was the owner of a number of slaves. These were listed in his estate when he died in 1801. Possibly two of these remained members of the household over the years. His older brother, John, a member of the 56th Georgia is also listed as the owner of 1 slave.

Johnson, Marion F. He was very young, 15 or 16, when he enlisted at Bowdon in July, 1861. His father, William P. Johnson, is listed as a prosperous farmer with an estate valued at \$19,000 and a personal value of \$7,000, a relative high figure for this time. William is listed as the owner of 35 slaves. We do not know how many of these were adults or how many were children. More than likely a considerable number were children as large families for the slaves were encouraged.

King, Edward W. He was a 19-20-year-old when he enlisted at Decatur, Ga. in November, 1862. His father, C. W. King, a farmer, is listed in 1860 with an estate value of \$1,000 and owning 1 slave.

Mabry, Charles He was a 25-year-old farmer of the Kansas community when he enlisted at Bowdon in July, 1861. He was the son of B. M. Mabry a fairly prosperous farmer with an estate in 1860 of \$5,000 and a personal value of \$12,500 who had moved to the area from North Carolina. B. M. is listed as the owner of 17 slaves while Charles is not listed as owning any. Do not know how many of these are adults.

McBurnett, Joshua M. and Thomas M. Thomas was a 20-year-old farmer and Joshua was 17-18 both living with their father, Nick and mother, Lucindia, in the Kansas community. Their father is listed as owning 2 slaves.

McDaniel, Charles Listed as the owner of 2 slaves, probably house servants as he was the President of the college.

McDaniel, John C. and William Walker These brothers were the sons of Charles McDaniel's brother, Phillip Alfred, of Texasville, Alabama. Their father was an owner of a large plantation and had a place on the Chattahoochee River called McDaniel's Landing for shipping cotton grown in south Alabama. He was the owner of a considerable number of slaves.

Morris, Thomas Jefferson A Thomas Jefferson Morris is listed as the owner of 1 slave. This could be his father(?).

Roberts, James M. He is listed as the owner of 1 slave.

Stevenson, William B. He was about 21 years old when he enlisted at Bowdon in July, 1861. He was a farmer living at home with his mother, Elvira, and 7 siblings. Elvira is listed as the owner of 3 slaves.

Total number of individuals or families who were slave owners: 11

Number of slaves owned by these 11 families: 74 plus those of the McDaniel family of Alabama.
