Cobb's Legion, Georgia Volunteers, was organized in August, 1861, as the Georgia Legion, and consisted of an infantry battalion of seven companies and a cavalry battalion of four companies. By S. O. No. 87, A. & L. G. O., dated April 10, 1863, it was directed that the infantry battalion and the cavalry battalion be separated into distinct organizations and each raised to a regiment, which order does not appear to have been carried out, except that the number of cavalry companies was increased. By S. O. No. 161, A. & L. G. O., dated July 11, 1864, the cavalry companies were directed to be designated the 9th Regiment Georgia Cavalry, but these companies appear to have continued to serve as a part of Cobb's Legion without change of designation.

Personally appeared before me James H. Barrow of the county of Counsell, State of Georgia, who, being duly sworn, deposes and says that he was on the 20th day of September, 1879, a bona fide resident of this State; that he enlisted in the military service of the Confederate States, or of this State, as a Soldier in Company B Regiment of Wm. Latta's Georgia volunteers that while engaged in such military service, to-wit: at the battle or engagement of Longville in the State of Miss. D. on the 14th day of Sept 1862, he was wounded in the ankle foot and that the same was amputated below the knee that he has not received the payment allowed him for such limb under an Act entitled an Act to carry into effect the last clause of Paragraph 1, Section 1, Article 7 of the Constitution of 1877, approved September 20th, 1879; that he has not supplied himself with an artificial leg; or that, not having done so, he prefers to supply himself with an artificial leg.
